1. Prosecco Corte Alta NV, Italy, 2008
Delicate and aromatic with a light body and fine bubbles. £5.25 Gl. £22.50 Btl.
2. Nicolas Feuillatte, Champagne, France, NV
A light, fresh and fruity Champagne with fine discreet bubbles and subtle overtones of apples, pears and citrus fruits. £7.95 Gl. £37.00 Btl.
3. Louis Roederer Brut Premier, Champagne, France, NV
Deliciously rich, with an overt fruitiness and nutty, yeasty notes, the finish is long, complex and rewarding. £49.00 Btl.
4. Taittinger Rosé, Champagne, France, NV
Classic aromatic Pinot fragrance of red raspberries and strawberries is offset by elegant, subtle floral and earth nuances. £55.00 Btl.
5. Veuve Clicquot Vintage, Champagne, France, 2002
The richness is balanced throughout with finesse and delicacy, a fine achievement for a quality conscious producer. £75.00 Btl.

White Wines

6. Michel Servin Ugni Blanc/Colombard Vin de Pays d'Oc, France 2010
Aromas of apples and citrus fruits on the nose lead to juicy melon and lemon fruit on the palate. £4.25 Gl. £14.50 Btl.
7. Bantry Bay, Chenin Blanc, South Africa, 2010
An aromatic wine with hints of tropical and citrus fruit on the nose and palate. £4.50 Gl. £15.95 Btl.
8. Aires Andinos, Sauvignon Blanc, Mendoza, Argentina, 2010
A zesty, clean and aromatic Argentinian Sauvignon Blanc that is fruity yet clean, crisp and refreshing. £4.75 Gl. £17.95 Btl.
9. Le Colline di San Giorgio, Italy, 2009
Pale lemon in colour with a fruit driven nose and a crisp, mineraly palate. £4.95 Gl. £18.95 Btl.
10. Baron de Baussac Viognier Vin de Pays d'Oc, France, 2010
This wine has a brilliant colour of luminous green-hued gold. The nose perfectly expresses the broad repertoire of fantastic flavours typical of Viognier, such as peach, apricot and almond. £5.25 Gl. £22.50 Btl.
11. Saint Desir Sauvignon Côtes de Gascogne, France, 2010
Bright yellow in colour with astonishing aromas of tropical fruits and peach on the nose. The smoothness and the intense flavours are held by a zesty refreshing acidity in the mouth. £24.00 Btl.
12. Fiano Fremondo, Sannio DOC, Italy, 2010
Fiano combines low yields with early ripening. Settesoli's example displays an attractive golden hue and a nose of ripe passion fruit. The palate is crisp and clean with an underlying nutty quality. £25.00 Btl.
13. Rueda Blanco, Marqués de Riscal, Spain, 2009/10
A light, delicate white wine, with an intensely aromatic bouquet and bursting with fruit. One for fans of Sauvignon Blanc. £26.00 Btl.
14. Costero Riesling, Chile, 2009
This is an expressive wine showing plenty of citrus and mandarin character. Well balanced with good minerality and racy acidity on the finish. £28.00 Btl.
15. Sonoma-Cutrer Sonoma Coast Chardonnay, California, 2008
Flavours of melon, pineapple and lime leap forward on the palate, alongside more traditional lemon, apple and pear. £29.00 Btl.
16. Gewurztraminer, Cave de Turkheim, Alsace France, 2009
Aromatic and dry, this Gewurztraminer shows white blossom and rose on the nose, followed by plenty of spice and hints of honey. Rich and well balanced with a dry finish. £30.00 Btl.
17. Albarino, Martin Codax, Spain, 2009
Delicate peachy aromas with hints of spice, herbs and traces of sweet fruits, a fresh and crisp palate rounded by hints of honey, peaches and stone fruits, a medium body and with a floral finish. £32.00 Btl.
18. Cape Mentelle, Semillon Sauvignon, Margaret River, Australia, 2009
This blend is becoming increasingly popular - the herby green fruit evident from the Sauvignon is perfectly complemented by the flowery Semillon. Absolutely mouthwatering - a fabulous wine. £33.00 Btl.
19. Chablis Jacques Decharmes Burgundy, France, 2009
Bright yellow in colour with astonishing aromas of tropical fruits and peach on the nose. The smoothness and the intense flavours are held by a zesty refreshing acidity in the mouth. £35.00 Btl.
20. Cape Crest Sauvignon Blanc Ta Mata, Hawkes Bay, New Zealand, 2008/09
A wonderfully bold departure from intense single-varietal unoaked Sauvignons, Cape Crest barrel-ferment theirs with the addition of small amounts of Semillon and Sauvignon Gris. £37.00 Btl.
21. Pouilly-Fumé, "Les Griottes", Jean-Pierre Bailly, Loire Valley, France, 2007/09
Patrice Bailly crafts his Pouilly Fumé from vines up to 40 years old. This wine is crammed with fragrant citrus and gooseberry fruit balanced by flinty, mineral laced acidity. £39.00 Btl.
22. Sancerre, Château de Sancerre, Loire Valley, France, 2007/08
This fabulous property is run by Marnier-Lapostolle, owners of Grand Marnier. Their vineyards are much sought after with flinty South-East facing slopes, and old vines. £42.00 Btl.

Red Wines

23. Alto Plano, Carmenere, Central Valley, Chile, 2009
A soft, easy-drinking wine with plenty of red fruit such as stewed plum and damsons. £4.25 Gl. £15.50 Btl.
24. Aires Andinos, Malbec, Mendoza, Argentina, 2009/10
A rich, ripe wine with plenty of smooth black fruit and warming hints of spice. £4.50 Gl. £16.95 Btl.
25. La Croisade Réserve, Grenache, Vin de Pays d'Oc, France, 2009/10
This wine comes from a selection of old vines of Grenache Noir surrounding the Mediterranean village of Cruzy. £4.75 Gl. £17.95 Btl.
26. Pavillon Trois Arches, Merlot, France, 2010
Deep ruby red in colour with a very charming nose of red berries and sweet spice. The palate is smooth, full of dark creamy fruit, with a lingering finish, providing a real treat in the mouth. £4.95 Gl. £19.00 Btl.
27. Otterbrook Mill, Shiraz, South Eastern Australia, 2009
A lovely, smooth wine showing notes of plum and dark, berry fruits with a delicate, spicy finish. £5.25 Gl. £21.00 Btl.
28. Zalze Pinotage, Western Cape, South Africa, 2009
This is a subtle and stylish wine with intense plum, mulberry and black fruit flavours. £22.00 Btl.
29. San Millan, Rioja Crianza, Spain, 2007
Red cherry colour of medium intensity with violet hues. Direct and fresh nose. Aromas of ripe red fruits with a subtle floral bouquet and notes of cinnamon and clove. £23.00 Btl.
30. Lirac, Cave Saint Desirat, Rhône Valley, France, 2007
From vines with an average age of 45 years this deeply coloured Lirac is a taste sensation and is absolutely brimming with black fruit and berry flavours. £24.95 Btl.
31. Il Monili Primitivo del Tarantino, Italy, 2009/10
With a spicy bouquet showing ripe red fruits, violets and notes of eucalyptus this is a soft and luxurious wine with excellent balance and structure. £25.95 Btl.
32. Fairleigh Estate, Pinot Noir, Marlborough, New Zealand, 2008/09
Hand harvested from vines on the southern side of the Wairau Valley, this is a classic Pinot from respected winemaker Brent Marris. £28.95 Btl.
33. Kangarilla Road, Cabernet Sauvignon, McLaren Vale, Australia, 2008
This 2002 Cabernet Sauvignon may be one of the best buys in Cabernet Sauvignon in the marketplace ... toasty oak and liquorice characteristics. £32.00 Btl.
34. Marsannay Rouge, Louis Latour, Loire Valley, France, 2007/08
A fruit-filled red Burgundy, from Louis Latour's Clos Chameroy winery, just north of Beaune. Only 20% of the wine has been fermented in oak for added complexity without sacrificing purity of fruit. £35.00 Btl.
35. Amarone della Valpolicella Classico Cantina di Negrar, Italy, 2007
A classic Amarone from vineyards located in the heart of the Negrar hills. The fruity bouquet shows black cherries and prunes, as well as a hint of sweet spice. £42.00 Btl.

Rose Wines

36. Cuvée de Richard Rose, Vin de Pays de l'Aude, France, 2010
Bright and crisp, with very subtle strawberry fruit and a refreshing dryness. The small proportion of Muscat adds a dash of juicy grapeyness. £4.50 Gl. £15.50 Btl.
37. Boschendal Rosé, Coastal Region, South Africa, 2010
From one of South Africa's original wine estates. Showing ripe cherries and strawberries on the nose and a crisp, fruity palate that is clean and refreshing on the finish. £5.75 Gl. £24.50 Btl.
38. Sainte Victoire Famille Negrel, Côtes de Provence, France, 2010
Bright salmon pink; typical of the fresh but warm Provence style. Refined and complex on the nose, with summer fruit and floral notes. £28.50 Btl.

Dessert Wines

39. Late Harvest Sauvignon Blanc, Concha y Toro, Half Bottle, Chile, 2007.
This sumptuous wine displays ripe papaya, peach and honey aromas. The palate is light, fresh and fruity with a long, subtle, honeyed finish. £5.50 Gl. £18.50 ½ Btl.
40. Clos L'Abeilley, Half Bottle Sauternes, France, 2005/07.
A superb Sauternes with excellent botrytis characteristics exhibiting wild honey aromas, luscious apricot fruit and excellent length! £23.50 ½ Btl.
41. Essensia Orange Muscat Andrew Quady, Half-bottle, California, 2007/2008.
Outrageously rich and delicious with a vibrant peachy, orangey bouquet. This is simply stunning with chocolate puds! £25.00 ½ Btl.
